Town of Note

(Caergybi)

Holyhead is the largest town of the county of Angelsey, and is probably best known for being a busy ferry port. From Angelsey,




ferries operate to Dublin, taking only 99 minutes to make the journey.

The town's Welsh name indicates that this was the site of a Roman for and the home of 6th century Saint Cybi. History buffs will find a number of historic and prehistoric sites nearby, including burial chambers at Barcloddiad Yr Gawres and a church in the sea at Porth Cwyfan. Llys Rhosyr, the court of Llywelyn Fawr, of one of the most powerful and charismatic Welsh princes has been discovered near the village of Newborough, on the South Western corner of the island. The Holyhead Maritime Museum is worth a visit - tucked in an old lifeboat station, the museum tells the story of the 100 or so shipwrecks which have happened in the vicinity, and about the ferry trade with Ireland. The jetty is used by Angelsey County Council to dock cruise ships visiting from around the world, and coaches can travel out on the jetty to pick up travelers bound for town and local tours. Holyhead experiences a maritime climate with cool summers and mild winters, often high winds, due to its location by the Irish Sea.
