


At our AUGUST meeting, the program will focus on Richard Burton, born at Pontrhydyfen, South Wales

# Recipe time!! kitchen-tested by your editor SGONAU CAERFFILI (Caerphilly scones)

(makes 5-10 depending on size prepared)

- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 1/2 oz butter
- 6 oz grated Caerphilly (or other cheddar) cheese
- 1/2 pint milk salt, pepper

Sift flour, salt, baking powder Rub in butter

add cheese & pepper


Mix well

add milk

Roll out dough to 1/2 inch thickness cut into rounds

bake on well-greased tray for 15-20 min at 425°F cool

It worked well to prepare these the night before on the baking tray, put in fridge, in the morning--- bake and serve warm for breakfast. Danteithiol! (delicious!)
