

Armchair Research: Wales Websites to Explore

Maps are essential for finding and understanding families.

They can answer questions such as:

Where did the family live?

Where did they work?

How far did your ancestor have to walk to meet his wife?

Which chapel/church was the easiest walk on Sunday?

What route did your ancestor take to get where they were going?

How did the countryside change over the decades?

Maps give a visual to the place names we find when seeking our heritage.

The best series of maps for Wales are found on the Library of Scotland website http://maps.nls.uk/. Select 'Ordnance Survey Maps' and then find 'Map Series—England, Wales and Great Britain'. Please note that the more rural areas of Wales will not be mapped on the earliest of these maps. After you select a series, you will see several options including zoomable overlay layers on modern maps. This is very helpful to see where the 'old' place is today. It may be under a motorway or shopping centre.

The Six-inch map series is a good one to start with. Clicking on it will take you to a page where you will need to select the map series again in box 2. Zoom in to find the area of interest. Click on the rectangle and the historic map links will appear on the right side, then click your choice and zoom in to see the details.

This is a section of the 1874-75 survey of the village where my grandmother was born in 1892. By the time of her birth it had grown into a coal mining town.
